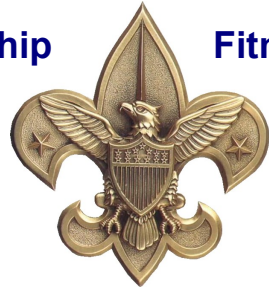


## The Scouting Values

Scouting is a values-based program with its own code of conduct that helps instill the values of character, citizenship and fitness.

**Character:** the development of initiative, courage and resourcefulness; respect for all people; and a desire to help others and give leadership to society.

**Citizenship:** to develop the sense of cheerful service to others, to one's community and country.

**Fitness:** the development of physical, mental and emotional fitness, including activities to nurture thinking, problem-solving and self-control.

## History of Troop 22

Troop 22 has been serving the youth of the greater Unionville-Chadds Ford area since 1924 conferring the rank of Eagle on over 130 young men.

The Unionville Elementary School Gymnasium has been home to our Troop meetings since 1960. Each month two, Monday evening, Troop meetings are held. We also have monthly camping weekends. Summer activities include one week of summer camp and two week adventures to National Boy Scout camps.

## Why Should A Boy Join Troop 22?

Our scouts learn lessons about life, and the value of being a person of character and integrity. They learn to get along with others, give their best effort, have confidence in themselves, care for others and treat others with respect.

Our scouts are given opportunities for adventure, exploration and leadership that other extra-curricular activities do not offer. It is through these experiences that our scouts gain strength of character and mature into young men. All the while, they will be having fun and forming lasting friendships.

## Troop 22 Offers:

Leadership training to the scouts and the opportunity to apply the skills. Young men learn best by doing. We are “youth run” – the Scouts choose their leaders, choose the destination and activities of the trips, what food will be cooked, and then they cook it and clean it up. Scouts plan and lead the troop meetings.

A wide variety of activities. In addition to camping, we hike historic trails, go backpacking, skiing, cycling, white water rafting, caving, canoeing, attend summer camp, etc. Older scouts are challenged by our summer trips to places such as New Mexico, the Bahamas, and Grand Tetons.

Depth of Leadership. Older scouts remain involved in our program giving the troop a depth of leadership skills and abilities.

A balance of FUN activities with advancement in rank. Boys who participate can easily attain the First Class rank within one year, and be recognized with an award.

Adult leadership which is trained and experienced. Most Assistant Scoutmasters have completed Scoutmaster Fundamentals (a five day training course). In addition, our Scoutmaster and a number of Assistant Scoutmasters have completed a training course that requires a year or more to complete.

Our own campsite in the Laurels Reserve of Unionville, tents, camping gear, and a trailer for transport.

Advisors to guide scouts through the Eagle project process.

Opportunity for parent participation. We encourage parents (mothers and/or fathers) to get involved - go camping with the troop, go on service projects, or contribute any way you can! Your interest and enthusiasm in the program influences your son's success in Scouting.
